ABSOLUTELY NO CHANGES TO HAIR

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Note: * Only Official School Cardigans will be allowed as an addition to the above. No other sweaters, hoodies, jackets etc. will be allowed. Any form of tattooing permanent or temporary (including henna) is not allowed.

Our new uniform is compulsory for new Form 1 students but optional for Forms 2-5. The shirts and skirts are available at Fanaz Garments, Caroni Savannah Road, Charlieville Telephone 665-6155/ 681-2008. Special orders may need to be placed in advance for long sleeve shirts and extra long skirts etc. The tie is made by Caribbean Jewelers and is available at school. Cardigans are available from Espree, Trincity Mall. It is advised to embroider names on cardigans. Slips to purchase cardigans must be collected at school.
